# A MONTH FOR MISSIONS

You are encouraged to participate in one, two, three or all four of these Mission projects during Lent – as the Lord leads you:

The Easter Basket Project

For the 19<sup>th</sup> year, a community-wide project is underway to assemble about 900 Easter baskets for disadvantaged youth in our area. The baskets are distributed through 13 agencies to local children "in need" aged 2-12. Items needed for the baskets are: small games and toys, individually-wrapped candy, snack cakes, box drinks, school supplies, toiletries (toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc.), and baskets or sand buckets. Cash donations will be used to buy items for specific age groups. Donations will be accepted through Friday, March 18, and baskets will be assembled Sunday, March 20. A collection box is in the Narthex and lower level entry area. For more information or to help with assembly, contact Kim Guyer or Debbey Roadcap. THANKS for your support!

Weekend Food Backpacks

We are packing 20 each week in March & April for students at Pence that have been identified as "food insecure" on the weekend. You have already generously responded with food items and monetary donations (over \$300 so far)! The project lasts 9 weeks so please, continue to share food or funds. We will be packing on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 and anticipate it taking about 30 minutes. If you would like to help, there is a sign up in the Narthex. Also, we do not need any more applesauce, peanut butter/cheese crackers, or oatmeal packets. We do still need donations of sleeves of crackers, 28 oz jelly in plastic containers, 28 oz. peanut butter, and cans of corn and green beans. See the list on page 4. Offering for UMCOR

Received on Easter Sunday, this special offering will help the United Methodist Committee on Relief in their work with refugees from the Syrian crisis.

According to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, more than 4 million people have fled to Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt, and Iraq. More than 7 million are internally displaced in Syria. The exodus of refugees to host countries throughout the region into Europe is placing a stain on available basic resources. Here are some of the ways UMCOR is working:

- UMCOR has provided more than \$2.4 million in emergency aid for people impacted by the crises in Syria and Iraq and it continues to support partners in meeting ongoing needs for refugees.
- In Jordan, UMCOR is working with partner International Orthodox Christian Charities to provide school kits for 6,048 Syrian refugee schoolchildren. They have also provided 16,800 health kits for Syrian refugees and distributed layette kits for 784 newborn babies.
- In partnership with UMCOR, Global Medic has packed and shipped 1,080 family emergency kits containing hygiene items such as soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes and Rainfresh household water purification units for those displaced by the conflict in Iraq.

Our Easter Offering - also known as "One Great Hour of Sharing" - will go to help support efforts to aid in this humanitarian crisis. Let's turn our prayers into good deeds.

A very generous philatelist evaluates the stamps given to him by UM Women's groups all over the state and gives us a percentage of the total value to use for a number of our mission projects. ANY postage stamp is welcome – cancelled or un-cancelled, U.S. or foreign, any value but not torn. Place them in the UM Women mailbox in the Coffee Social area. Please follow these special instructions:

- A. Bring the whole envelope or cut stamps off leaving at least 1/4-inch border around the stamp.
- B. Foreign stamps are great and sometimes more valuable.
- C. If you have postcards, turn in the whole card; don't cut or tear the stamp off the card!
- D. Leave rows of stamps intact.

Health kits provide basic necessities to people who have been forced to leave their homes because of human conflict or natural disaster. Health kits are also used as learning tools in personal hygiene, literacy, nutrition, and cooking classes. Value: \$12 per kit

#### •1 hand towel

O15 x 25 inches to 17 x 27 inches;

OKitchen, cleaning, and microfiber towels not acceptable.

#### •1 washcloth

#### •1 comb

OComb needs to be sturdy and longer than 6 inches long;

ONo pocket combs or picks please;

ORattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable with a minimum of 6 inches of teeth.

#### •1 metal nail file or nail clippers

ONo emery boards, please.

#### ●1 bath-size soap

O3 oz. and larger sizes only;

ONo Ivory or Jergens soap due to moisture content;

ODo not remove from original packaging.

#### ●1 toothbrush

OAdult size only; individually packaged!

ODo not remove from original packaging.

# 6 adhesive bandages

O¾ inch to 1 inch-size;

OCommon household Band-Aids.

#### •1 plastic bag

OOne-gallon size sealable bag only.

#### \$1.00 to purchase toothpaste





#### School Kit—all items must be NEW

In some countries, children don't have books or school supplies. Many have no schoolrooms; classes are held in inadequate or half-destroyed buildings, tents, or even the open air. School kits may be these children's only educational resources. Value: \$11 per kit

#### •1 pair blunt scissors

ORounded tip only;

ONo plastic scissors, please.

#### •3 pads of paper

OSpiral- or top-bound pads;

O150 sheets or less of loose-leaf paper can be substituted for 1 pad:

OCombination of spiral, top-bound, side-bound, or loose-leaf paper is acceptable;

ONo composition books, please.

#### •1 hand-held pencil sharpener

OMust be at least 1 inch long;

ORemove from packaging.

#### •1 30-centimeter ruler

OHard or flexible;

OCartoon characters are acceptable;

ONo advertisements please.

# •6 unsharpened pencils

ONo advertisements, religious, patriotic, military, or camouflage symbols, please;

OCartoon characters are acceptable.

# •1 2-inch or larger-size eraser

ONo advertisements, religious, patriotic, military, or camouflage symbols, please;

OCartoon characters are acceptable.

# •1 24-count box of crayons

OOnly 24-count boxes, please.

# ●1 14x16 inch cloth bag

OHomemade or purchased bags are both acceptable;

OHeavy-duty fabric only, such as denim, corduroy, drapery fabric, etc.;

ONo advertisements, religious, patriotic, military, or camouflage symbols, please;

Closures are optional but must be buttons, snaps, or Velcro sewn in middle of opening, if used.
