

Questioning if it is a good use of resources to continue, we will monitor the blended service attendance on October 1 and October 8. If it is determined that it is not in the best interest of Dayton United Methodist Church to continue, we may no longer offer the 11:15 service after October 8.

#### **They Asked - DUMC Delivered!**

The Cleanup Bucket project in response to Hurricane Harvey was a great success. Your designated giving to UMCOR and the buckets totaled \$3,600 as of September 24. You quickly - and very generously - brought items as well and Dayton UMC delivered 26 buckets to Asbury UMC on September 18! More than 75% of the items needed were donated so we only needed to purchase about \$600 worth of supplies to complete the 26 buckets. Ours were part of the 400 that were given by all the UM Churches in the Harrisonburg District and those were added to the State collection. We've learned that the UMC of Virginia had to rent another truck to send all the buckets to the UMCOR distribution center in Louisiana! Praise God!

#### Effectively Inviting Others to Church

Rev. Dr. Doug Powe of Wesley Seminary says many people just don't like inviting other people to church, in part because faith is so personal and in part because they fear rejection. He provides four clues for inviting in a way that is genuine, specific, honest, and expectant.

- 1. The invitation should be about a **genuine connection** and not staged. It is best to invite individuals to an event that has bearing on their life or appeals to their interests. If we translate this to inviting someone to church, then we share with them how the new sermon series on addictions may be helpful as they deal with a child in rehabilitation. The point is the invitation comes across as thoughtful and something that connects with the other person.
- 2. **Be specific.** Often, when we do invite, our invitations are very general. Simply saying, "Why don't you come to my church on Sunday," is not as specific as "I would love for you to come to Main Street Congregation at 10 a.m. Our address is 123 Main Street, and I will meet you in the parking lot." Be specific!
- 3. **Be honest** about what we know and do not know. Another reason many of us do not invite is that we are



afraid someone You're Invited! may ask us questions to which we do not know the answer, such as, "Why do bad things happen to good people?" It is okay if we do not have all the answers. This communicates to others that you are not trying to sell them a bill of goods. Honesty goes a long way and individuals respect those who are upfront with them.

4. It is important to invite with expectant hope. Do not invite with a defeatist attitude. There are times when we so underplay the invitation it comes across as if we really do not want the other person to come. But it's equally important not to go to the opposite extreme and be overly effusive. The goal is an invitation that leaves space for others to say yes without painting an overly negative or rosy picture.

It is disheartening to not see visitors on Sundays. 85% of all who affiliate with a local church do so because someone in that church invited them. Ultimately, we are inviting others to experience a transforming relationship with God in Christ. The majority of unchurched say they are open to being asked. -Pastor Bruce
