
Advent Worship Schedule



Church Financial Transparency

Your Finance Committee works hard and takes very seriously the wise and faithful management of the funds given to the Lord's work in the life of our church. The Committee is comprised of individuals with financial expertise who desire is to provide our church family regular full disclosure and proper understanding of our financial condition. It has been a concern that the weekly stewardship report in the bulletin has not adequately communicated both the current needed and the actual level of congregational support. There is also the concern that with inadequate communication the assumption is being made that the "lights are on" and therefore all is well. The information below is provided by the Committee to help address these concerns.

We historically have received much larger contributions in the year-end months of November and December. However, every year the Finance Committee still has had to withdraw from the limited assets in the Reserve Fund to make up the significant shortfalls. Your Committee and pastor have taken steps to encourage stronger and more consistent congregational stewardship, and are now studying ways to reduce the mortgage.

We ask that you pray for our church's leaders to discern God's direction, our congregation's commitment to our shared ministry and future together, and our own individual response to how we have so richly prospered by God's amazing grace.

From the DUMC Trustees:

Most of you are aware of the water damage we discovered in September to our hand bells in a storage closet behind the sanctuary. Our insurance company paid us \$10,000 for this damage. The total cost to refurbish the bells and other cost involved in the re-

pair was \$11,500. The estimate for the damage was made by the bell company was based on pictures and discussions with them.

A generous member has made a contribution of \$1500 to complete the total cost involved in the estimate to refurbish the bells.

After shipping the bells to PA and upon visual inspection, they found that 7 of the big bells could not be refurbished due to rusting. The cost to replace these 7 bells is \$4,100. It would show a great appreciation and thanks to our hand bell choir if we could come up with the \$4,100 to completely cover the cost.

THE GIVER:



Many Christian families struggle with what role — if any — Santa Claus should play in their Christmas celebrations. No matter what you decide, it's fascinating to know the history of the real-life St. Nicholas.

Born about 270 A.D., Nicholas was a bishop in Myra, or modern-day Turkey. In the year 325, he was part of the Council of Nicaea, which produced the Nicene Creed.

Nicholas, known for his generosity, often gave away his money anonymously. According to tradition, he secretly provided dowries for the three daughters of a bankrupt merchant. Nicholas threw two bags of gold through open windows and placed the third in a stocking hanging by the fireplace to dry. Thus began the Christmas tradition of placing gifts in stockings.

St. Nicholas is quoted as saying, "The giver of every good and perfect gift has called upon us to mimic God's giving, by grace, through faith, and this is not of ourselves."
