<u>"What Matters Most"</u>

This month we launch a spiritual growth campaign: **BETTER TOGTHER – 40 Days of Community.** Why are we focusing on the concept of community? Well, the Bible is very clear about this. It is God's plan. God's design. God wired us this way: to be in relationship with God and with

each other. It is what matters most in life.

We cannot be all God wants us to be, do all God wants us to do, fulfill the purposes we were put on this earth to fulfill by ourselves. It is simply impossible! We have to do life in relationship to other people. It is what matters most.

Romans 12:14 says, "Since we are all one body in Christ, we belong to each other and each of us needs all the others." We need each other and we belong to each other in the church. God says community is not optional!

Now, as with most Biblical truth, the concept of community is radically counter-cultural. The American dream began with the Declaration of Independence. Being totally independent and self-sufficient has been deemed a virtue. To have to depend on someone or something then becomes sinful. And too many, even in the church, have bought into the myth that the key to happiness is independence.

Just the opposite is true! God says the key to happiness is not independence but inter-dependence. We all need each other. We need other believers to walk with us, to work with us, to watch over us, to weep with us, to wait with us, and to witness with us. This is what the $40 \ Days \ of \ Community$ is all about – to deepen our relationships with one another and with the Lord, and to deepen our love for our neighbors, the communities we live in, and the world the Church serves. Many thanks to all those who have generously given to Dayton United Methodist Church and to the glory of the Lord over the past year. Without contributions like yours, we wouldn't be able to carry out the various ministries and mission of our church, "we invite everyone to become disciples of Christ by loving and serving God and actively living out their faith." As a result of your faithful stewardship during 2017, we were able to participate and/or support the following ministries:

- Youth mission trip to Atlanta
- Open Doors
- Wednesday night community dinners
- Pence backpack program
- Vacation Bible School
- UMCOR and other conference programs including Haiti hot lunch and cleaning buckets
- Easter baskets project

The Finance Team reports that through the year ended December 31, 2017, total income (both budgeted and designated) was \$425,438 and total expenditures (both budgeted and designated) were \$417,936 resulting in net income of \$7,502. This is the first year in the past four years we have not had to withdraw funds from reserves to cover operating expenditures. What a blessing! As we look to the future, we are currently anticipating a shortfall in 2018, mainly due to the annual debt service requirement for our mortgage loan. Effective February 1st, the interest rate on the mortgage loan will increase from 4.0% to 4.75%. Our annual debt service requirement will increase to \$99,600. Church Council, Trustees and the Finance Team are working together to identify actions to address this.

Giving regularly to our Church is one of the ways we express what it means to be disciples. Our Church family is comprised of very generous people. We appreciate your ongoing and steady support of Dayton United Methodist Church and may you continue to give to the Church's ministries and mission in 2018.
