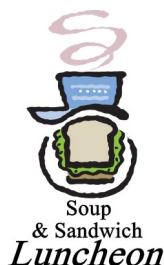
Sunday Morning Schedule Beginning January 7

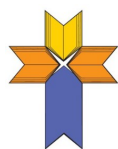

Did you know that our church library has three branches? There is a library cart in the coffee social room, a small library behind the beige folding doors downstairs, and a library in the downstairs music room. Each location has a simple sign out sheet or index card system for borrowing materials.

The library cart upstairs contains mostly newer releases of faith-based books about contemporary topics and some popular Christian fiction. A good selection of newer children's books is also on the cart.

The downstairs library room has older books, and some newer books, grouped by categories. As well a variety of Bibles and Biblical references, this room contains devotionals, inspirational fiction, materials of special interest to women, stories of heaven, Christmas stories, nonfiction books by Christian authors, works on prayer, resources on world religions, books on Methodism, works about famous Christians, and many other books to help in living a life of faith.

The downstairs music room is the home of our adult study curriculums and a few young adult and confirmation resources. You can also find multimedia kits, UMW resources, theater resources, and some newer nonfiction and devotionals here. The downstairs music room also has the church's largest selection of children's books.

To donate books, please leave them in the library behind the folding doors downstairs. Thank you for contributions! Due to spacing constraints in the library, we are only able to accept faith-based books. Please consider donating general fiction and secular non-fiction to a local library or to Booksavers in Harrisonburg.

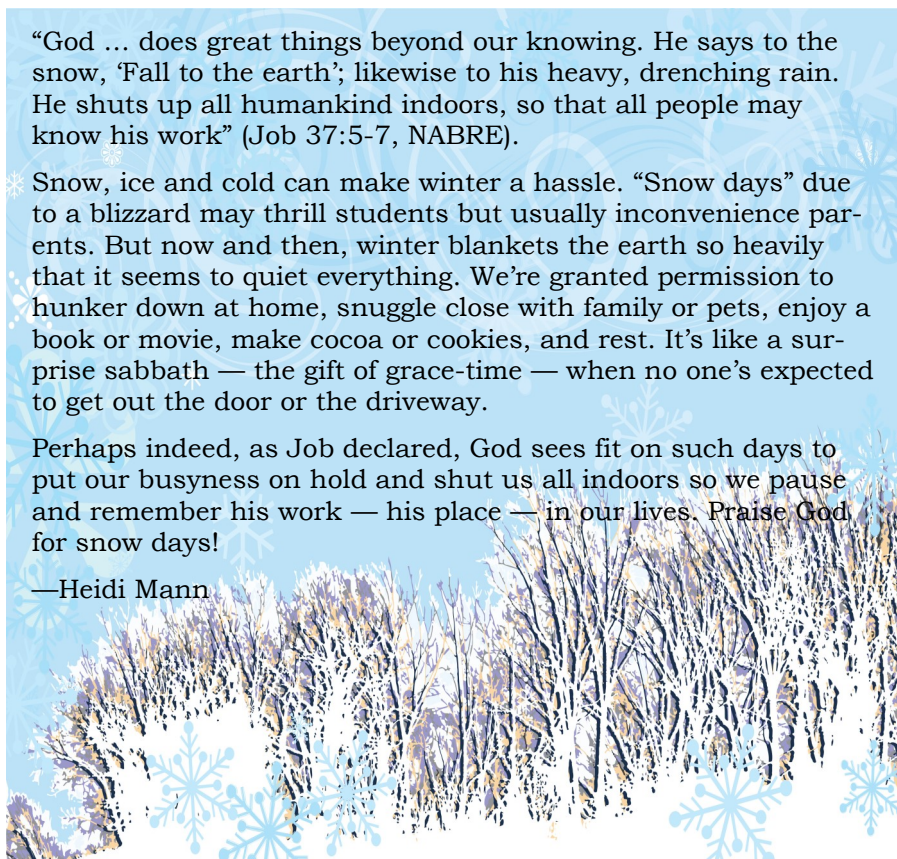

On Dec. 2nd our youth were invited to be part of the Town of Dayton parade. We had about 15 members ride in a hay wagon for the parade while tossing out candy! At the parade's conclusion, we served hot chocolate to the Dayton residents and led Christmas carols during the Tree lighting ceremony.

We finished off the month assisting a local program from the Braithwaite Studios called the Giving Tree. They identify needy families in the Dayton area and allow people and groups to supply gifts they otherwise couldn't afford for Christmas. Our youth 'adopted' three families, with 8 children total, and went shopping. We spent a total of \$1,400 dollars for over 50 gift boxes and wrapped them during our Christfest celebration for these families. We also enjoyed caroling for our Dayton residents during the evening of Christfest.

Dear Virginia Annual Conference,

Last year I kicked off the Bible Challenge to participate in daily readings from Genesis to Revelation. I want to express my appreciation those of you who stuck to the daily readings. Several of you in the conference shared your testimonies from this experience:

- “I’ve been in the church for 30 years and have never read the Bible cover to cover.”
- “My husband and I are diligently reading together every morning.”
- “I’m glad you’ve challenged us to read this year.”
- “What are we going to do next year?”

As we come to the end of our 2017 Bible Challenge, I pray you have found this journey through the Bible uplifting and enriching. Bible study is very essential to building our faith. Through God’s Word, we gain an understanding that God is the one who gives the gift of knowledge for us to live productive lives as believers. I would like to invite you again this year to read the Bible chronologically (in the order of events). The readings will be posted on the conference website and in the monthly Advocate. If you were not successful in completing the challenge let me encourage you to try again this year.

Tips on reading the Bible daily:

1. Start reading the Bible today.
2. Set aside a specific time and place each day. Set your schedule and then stick to it. Mornings are great; but feel free to use any time that works consistently with your schedule.
3. Get a good study Bible to help to illuminate the meaning of the original Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek text.
4. Choose a translation to use during your reading.
5. Say a short prayer to God before you begin, asking the Holy Spirit to give you wisdom and understanding.
6. Dive in and enjoy the richness of God’s Word!
7. Apply God’s Word to your life.

Bible study should be practical and applicable. I assure you that these seven steps will help you begin a journey in becoming a “life-long learner” of God’s Word.
