Refugee Resettlement Ministry

Linking Communities is a Church World Service initiative that partners local families with newly arrived refugee families. Its goal is REFUGEE to form connections and strengthen the fabric of understanding, acceptance and integration across our community. Linking Communities allows individual families or small groups who might not

have the resources to provide a full-refugee sponsorship, the opportunity to reach out to newly arrived refugees in friendship and support at whatever level they can. Local individuals/groups interested in partnering with a refugee family go through a 3 hour training. The training covers program expectations, background about refugee resettlement, refugees sharing their experiences, L.C. families talking about joys and challenges, and scenarios for discussion. Dear Friends,

I read an interesting article this week entitled, "Why Are So Many Churches Empty?" The writer answered the question with typical answers such as need for good parking, nursery quality, signage, and creative bulletin covers. Rev. Shan Stanford wrote the article and he said that he doesn't believe these things and the real answers lie in deeper places. He quotes a pastor as saying that, "Our church has substituted ritual for relationship." Stanford says to practice real faith not just belonging to a church's membership rolls - requires deepening relationships set within the community of God. He says people don't attend churches because of nice slogans, artful worship, and outstanding facilities. They are looking for something more.

I have taught extensive Bible studies in every church I have served and I can remember starting with a fresh group of people who didn't know one another, but after extensive study together the group became very close. Disciple is a course many of you have taken and it is a full two year experience. Understanding God's Word and being able to put it into action brings people together. People who study God's Word together not only learn how to apply God's Word they learn, but how to live with one another. Stanford says it may oversimplify to say that in-depth Bible Study grows churches. But it is not too simple **earn** to say that in-depth Bible study potentially transforms a congregation at a deep, personal level. When we focus on things about which God cares, we learn to care about them, as well.

Jrow In-depth Bible Study does two things. One - it provides a means to know and love God beyond Sunday morning sermon or daily devotional. Bible Study teaches us about the purpose and plan of God. Some Bible Studies go beyond to teach us about creation, covenant, and community. Two - in-depth Bible Study provides examples of what it means to love like God. By the end of the Biblical Story, we discover what it means to form a life around our faith in God - particularly through the gift of God's son Jesus Christ. I share Rev. Stanford's view that scripture draws us not only to God but to each other. I challenge you to look at your church on Sunday mornings. Is it full or do you have a good portion of your church empty? If you'd like your church to grow, talk to your pastor about offering an "indepth" Bible Study. Disciple is one of those studies. Covenant Bible Study is another. Cokesbury has a multitude of good studies. Call me if you are having trouble deciding. Let's "grow" our churches by studying God's Word. Remember -"Scripture draws us not only to God but to each other!"

Let's "study" together!

Hygiene kits provide basic necessities to people who have been forced to leave their homes because of human conflict or natural disaster. These kits are also used as learning tools in personal hygiene, literacy, nutrition, and cooking classes. Value: \$12 per kit

●1 hand towel

♦15 x 25 inches to 17 x 27 inches;

♦Kitchen, cleaning, and microfiber towels not acceptable.

•1 washcloth

•1 comb

♦ Comb needs to be sturdy and longer than 6 inches long;

♦No pocket combs or picks please;

♦ Rattail combs/combs w/out handles are acceptable with a minimum of 6 inches of teeth.

• 1 metal nail file or nail clippers

♦No emery boards, please.

●1 bath-size soap

♦3 oz. and larger sizes only;

 $\lozenge \mbox{No}$ Ivory or Jergens soap due to moisture content;

 $\Diamond \mathsf{Do}$ not remove from original packaging.

●1 toothbrush

♦Adult size only; individually packaged!

♦ Do not remove from original packaging.

•6 adhesive bandages

♦ Common household Band-Aids.

•1 plastic bag

♦One-gallon size sealable bag only.

School Kit—all items must be NEW
