I want to thank all those who were involved in making my stay and itineration possible while traveling in Oregon, Virginia, Western North Carolina, Northern Illinois, and Indiana Conferences. I've so enjoyed meeting new host families and getting together with families whom I have met before. A special thanks to all those who hosted me in their house, provided the transportation to get me around the conferences. Many miles, great conversation and a glimpse of the area were much appreciated.

June and July 2018 were busy months - traveling to many places, speaking to small groups and large groups, small churches and large churches, sleeping in a new place sometimes every night, staying in some places for numerous nights, and always enjoying the conversation along the way. I have appreciated the way in which my message was received and loved conversations following each presentation. You have made me feel very welcomed.

Now I am happy to be back in Cambodia with all those we serve through the Street Children Ministry and community outreach. Our goal is always to share the Gospel of Jesus and God's love with all in our outreach area. The Street Children Ministry requires nearly \$40,000 to fulfill all the objectives for our community which includes school uniforms, school supplies, after school academic assistance, Sunday School, special observation days such as the international day of the child, and our Easter and Christmas Pageants as well as our outreach to the HIV/Aids community, elderly, and victims of domestic violence. How grateful we are to receive funds for Street Children Ministry (Advance #14921A) throughout the year to support the actual work of my ministry.

Thank you again for your warm hospitality and continued support of the missionary program of the United Methodist Church and the Street Children Ministry in Cambodia and a special thanks to the all those who prepared the itineration, made all the contacts, and made the visit to my supporting churches possible.
