Friends,

This is not an easy announcement to make because being a pastor is who I am, not what I do. Being the pastor of Dayton UMC these past 30 months has been my great joy. Dayton UMC is a wonderful church to serve because you the people are such caring and loving Christians. And living in the Central Valley has been such a blessing in our lives. However, the DISCIPLINE of the UMC requires all clergy under appointment to retire at age 72. Next year I will be 72, so I will be retiring at the end of June 2019. I think a few have surmised this, but most are thinking I am in my 60s. I have carefully avoided communicating my actual age in order not to be a "lame duck" leader. I have worked hard to do as much as I could to help DUMC move forward in the time I have had, and will continue to do so for the remaining months.

Our being sent to Dayton UMC at this time has served to help accomplish some very important and necessary objectives to position the church for its future. A sufficient time has passed to allow for the healing of losing a very beloved pastor who had faithfully served this church family and community so well. Additionally, we have re-structured and re-purposed our Leadership Team (Church Council) to be an envisioning, implementing, evaluating body that is working to develop a blueprint for making disciples of Jesus Christ. This year we now have a leader on the Council for each Ministry Team which will enable our church to move forward from maintenance to growth. Critical to the church's future has been the miraculous outpouring of financial gifts to reduce our mortgage and thereby establish a sustainable ministry budget.

It is difficult to accept the fact that time catches up with us. I simply do not have the strength and mental acuity needed to successfully propel this body of Christ into new areas of outreach. That will be for the younger, tech savvy, new spiritual leader God will send to be your pastor. Only by the grace of God have I helped us take some good steps forward. Be diligent to pray for your church's leaders and the appointment process during this season of transition.



Worth It

Read Matthew 4:18-22

Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed Him. -Matthew 4:22 (NIV)

When I was younger, I felt called to follow God instead of my friends. Trying to get me to hang out with them instead of attending Bible study, my friends would say things like, "You can go next week" or "Do you actually believe in that stuff?" I would tell them, "I know that I would not have many of the good things in my life if it were not for God and the relationship I have built with God through Bible study". Even though my friends would criticize me and leave me out of things because of my decision, I would go every week to Bible study. I knew I was doing the right thing. I ended up knowing much more about God than my friends did, and when we were teenagers my friends started asking me questions about my faith.

Not everyone chooses to follow God, perhaps because it seems that doing so means having to give up so much. But what we give up for our faith is far less fulfilling than what we gain by living faithfully. Choosing to follow Christ may seem difficult in the beginning, but it is worth it in the end.

Prayer: Dear Lord, guide us to do what is right and to help others.

JAN. 6 - John Wesley's Covenant Renewal Service

In 1775, John Wesley introduced a covenant service as an important part of spiritual life in the Methodist Societies. This renewal service was a time for the Methodists to gather annually in a time of self-examination, reflection, and dedication, wholly giving up themselves and renewing covenant with God. Repentance through confession and commitment was a key focus of the service, demanding humility from those willing to submit themselves to the dynamic words stated within the liturgy.

According to Wesley's journal, though the covenant renewal service was held on various occasions throughout the year, by the end of his life, the service was observed typically on or the Sunday nearest January 1st. The covenant renewal service is a practice that continues in churches and Christian communities today, often near the beginning of the new year. It has undergone many revisions and adaptations, but its purpose as an evocative ceremony of commitment to ongoing discipleship and Christ-like character has always remained intact.
