We are blessed by a very generous community: they recognize our commitment to this effort by opening our doors and offering our spacious fellowship hall and have responded in kind. Various faith communities have ALL dinners already covered for these three hosting weeks! Our greatest need during this time will be help driving the bus to and from Harrisonburg for guest transportation. Graham Witt will be the lead volunteer for arranging the calendar. Please contact him if you have any interest or questions. We will also be collecting breakfast items and paper goods from the congregation for support of Week 2...stay tuned during Sunday services for more details and look for the signup board in the Coffee Social Area around Thanksgiving time.

Highlights from the Congregational Meeting on October 27 -- by Lena Osborne, Council Chair

We began congregational meetings while we were struggling with our financial challenges and were requested to continue quarterly meetings. For the first time in our meetings, we are able to share that our expenditures did not exceed our income. We are also 7 months ahead of scheduled loan payoff.

It is good that we can pay our bills without borrowing money as in recent years. A church member loaned DUMC \$10,000, without interest, so we could meet our financial commitments last year. We were recently able to repay that loan.

Thanks to the Finance Committee, Council and especially Betsy Hedrick for all their work in making this possible by refinancing and reducing our monthly mortgage payments by approximately half.

It is good to celebrate our improved financial status but we cannot get comfortable and ask that you continue to support your church financially.

The United Methodist Church has encouraged us to have a short concise Vision describing our church and congregation and complementing our Mission statement.

After much discussion, Council recommends

Connect. Serve. Love.

In choosing a vision statement we tried to think about relationships with each other (within the walls of this church), about relationships with others (outside the walls) and about our relationship to God, as a church family/congregation. You will be hearing more about the Vision and we would appreciate your feedback. Our vision will be used on shirts (which we plan to order and sell early next year) as well as printed materials.

When BB&T closed its Dayton branch, we were approached to become a member of Park View Credit Union -- at no cost to our church but to give you the ability to apply for loans, accounts etc. There is information in narthex. If you would like to take advantage of their services you will need to get letter from Mary Beth that you are affiliated with DUMC.


We did not have many for our Church Cleanup Morning but they accomplished much!
