

Every Friday, Open Doors intends to help shelter guests with personal laundry. The Dayton UMC Youth washed, dried and folded

over 25 loads of laundry for our guests.



The following week we supported the *Angel Tree* project, managed by Braithwaite Studios in Dayton. This program reaches out through *local* schools to support families that are struggling to make ends meet. The gift requests range from baby and infant supplies to winter coats and boots, pajamas to jeans, hats and gloves. Many of these families are also touched by our weekend food backpack program. A CRY, A WORD OF DELIVERANCE - by Pastor Jenny Pay

"A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." Isaiah 40:3-5 (NRSV)

These words from the prophet Isaiah are echoed by John the Baptist as he enters the scene in Judea. The Gospels tell us that he "is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, 'A voice cries out in the wilderness." Yet, I wonder if Isaiah had any inkling as to the eccentric character he was prophesying about! It seems to me we all have that one relative who is a little bit odd, you know what I'm talking about. Well, John is, without a doubt, that relative in Jesus' family! He enters into the Advent season like a bull in a china shop. Amid the jingling of bells and carolers singing "Silent Night," we hear a cry that sounds like fingernails on a chalkboard. The discordant voice that disrupts our warm thoughts of a cooing baby in a manger. From his unconventional clothing choices to his questionable dining, John is perhaps not the person we would choose to prepare the way for God's Messiah. Yet he is God's choice. From the time the Angel visits Zechariah in the Temple to announce Elizabeth is going to bear a son, we learn that this child will bring many people to God and "make ready a people prepared for the Lord." It is an honorable role, it is a vital role and, my friends, it seems to me it is to be our role as well. For we too are called to bring people to God and to prepare them to receive the Lord in their lives. To make God's people ready for when Jesus comes again. To let them know that God's gift of grace is for them. That's what this season is all about. Preparing for Jesus to enter our world once more as we celebrate his gift of love for all people. So this Advent Season in the midst of the parties and the shopping let us be the voice shouting in Dayton and Harrisonburg and Bridgewater, "Prepare the way of the Lord!" For then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together.

Prayer: God of us all, we pray that we would be bold witnesses of your love at work in the world. Help us to share the good news of your son's coming until the day when all people see your glory revealed. Amen.

The Power of Choosing Love

Martin Luther King Jr., whose life and legacy we honor this month, spoke often about the power of love. In fact, he equated the practice of nonviolence with "absolute commitment to the way of love."

Love, declared the minister and activist, "is the only force capable of transforming an enemy into a friend." And, he said, anyone who's "devoid of the power to love" is "devoid of the power to forgive."

King distinguished between true love and "empty sentimentalism," however. He taught — and showed — that love is "the active outpouring of one's whole being into the being of another."

Jesus' sacrifice on the cross is the ultimate "active outpouring" of love, and we can choose to follow his example daily.

"Because of Calvary I'm free to choose," writes Max Lucado in *When God Whispers Your Name*. "No occasion justifies hatred; no injustice warrants bitterness. I choose love. Today I will love God and what God loves."
