Hello Dayton United Methodist Church Family,

As many of you may already know my husband, Bobby, and I have been involved in missions for several years now. Bobby went back to school full-time and received a ministry degree last year. The Lord has definitely given



us both hearts for missions and our long time desire has been to go into full-time service. Well, the time and opportunity to follow God's call has arrived!

While we have made many trips and have served extensively in Guatemala over the years, we never really felt that was where God was leading us full-time. It's always been important to us that we only go where we feel God's calling and where we see a clear vision of the work to be done.

Prayer support

If you feel led to support through prayer, we would love for you to pray for these areas:

- That our efforts would have a lasting impact on the kids of Robin's Nest.
- That God would use Bobby and I to do immeasurably more than we could ask or predict for these children and the community near Robin's Nest and His Kingdom.
- That Bobby and I would remain healthy and safe during our time in Jamaica

Bobby and I never planned to become long-term missionaries in Jamaica,

but the Lord had a different vision. In February of this year, we were led to the Robin's Nest Children's Home in the mountains above Montego Bay, Jamaica. Robin's Nest is a nonprofit Christian orphanage that "provides a safe, loving and Christ-centered environment where each child could grow physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually." The children, many of whom have come from situations of trauma and neglect, range from the ages of infant to 16 years.

Although Covid has placed many obstacles in our path, later this month we will be returning to Robin's Nest as the on-site directors. This position requires a two to four-year non-compensated commitment.

James, the brother of Jesus, wrote, "Pure and genuine religion in the sight of God the Father means caring for Orphans and widows in their distress and refusing to let the world corrupt you." James 1:27. In the past few months, Bobby and I have sold our home and most of our possessions in obedience to the Lord's desire that we tend to the orphans placed in our care at Robin's Nest.

We firmly feel we cannot impact the lives of these children without the prayer support of our family, friends and community. That is why we are asking that you consider partnering with us on this endeavor. Together we can be a small part in what God is doing to impact the lives of these children.

As exciting as this time is, I am also experiencing great sadness in knowing I will be leaving you, my DUMC family. My time here with you all over the past four years has been such a tremendous blessing to me and a true gift from God. While I know I will miss you all, I am comforted to know that Pastor Jenny and others plan to try and form a team from here at DUMC to come down for short-term mission trips with us! I will be looking so forward to that time.
