Mission Central combines the resources of the United Methodist churches of the Harrisonburg District to serve the families of the Shenandoah Valley.

Our mission is to share God's love in Jesus Christ to those in need. Located at Cedar Grove UMC on the edge of Harrisonburg, Mission Central offers a growing number of services including a **Children's Clothes Closet** and the lending of medical equipment through **Equipment for Caring**. Volunteers make Mission Central possible. Volunteers are always needed; we especially have a need for volunteers who are bilingual.

Equipment for Caring is a loaner closet that includes hospital beds, wheelchairs, walkers, bedside commodes, etc. as well as disposable supplies including adult diapers, briefs, and wound care. Two retired nurses developed the closet and it has continued to grow over the past few years providing many vital items that families can use to help care for their loved ones at home.

Mondays, 9:00 AM – 11:00 AM Thursdays, 5:00 PM - 7:00 PM

Items that can be donated:

The Children's Clothes Closet is a true work of the heart that started as a project of the United Methodist Women of McGaheysville UMC that grew into an amazing mission outreach ministry that now serves over 550 families in our area each year. Children can receive clothing, pajamas, 2 pairs of underwear and 2 pairs of socks each month. One pair of shoes can be received every 3 months and coats can be received 1 time/season. Diapers are also given out 2 times/month and the closet has a variety of other items for newborns such as blankets, bibs, wash cloths, towels and swaddles.

Hours for "shopping" are:

2nd and 4th Wednesdays, 10:00 AM – 1:00 PM 2nd and 4th Thursdays, 5:00 PM - 7:00 PM 3rd Tuesday of each month, 5:00 PM - 7:00 PM

Items that can be donated:

- *Children's clothes including winter coats
- *Sizes for infant to 15 years old
- *Clean children's shoes, socks, undergarments
- *Disposable diapers all sizes


